Avi Reichenberg, Ph.D., is a neuropsychologist and epidemiologist. He is professor of Preventive Medicine and Psychiatry at the Ichan School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York, and Director of the Population Research and Environmental Epidemiology Program at the Seaver Center for Autism Research and Treatment, New York.

Dr. Reichenberg received his PhD from the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. He published more than 200 peer-reviewed papers. His current research focuses on understanding how genes and environments shape brain development, and how faulty brain development leads to the emergence of psychiatric disorders across the life span; identifying new risk factors and risk periods for abnormal brain development; and deriving potential preventive strategies.
