Shlomo Mendlovic is the Director of the Shalvata Mental Health Center. He completed his MSc and PhD theses at Weizmann Institute of Science, his MD at Tel Aviv University, and his MHA at Bar Ilan University. During the past decade, he is strongly invested in the field of the meta-theory of psychotherapy. Shlomo published three books: "A Mind to be Touched" (Dyonon Press, Tel Aviv University, 2005) is an introductory book that tracks the post-modern nature of contemporary psychoanalytic theories; "On the Social Order of the Multiple Selves" (Resling, 2009) maps the post-modern crisis of psychoanalysis, defines criteria for its solution, and proposes a provocative model in which multiple selves are organized in a social order; and "I Singular-Plural: Space, Content and Order in the World of the Multiple Selves" (Tel-Aviv University Press, 2015) elaborates on the post-post-modern conceptualization of psychoanalysis and proposes a novel research tool (the MATRIX) studying psychotherapy. He currently heads the MATRIX Research Team, combining theory, clinical experience and machine-learning technology in order to uncover the mysteries of psychotherapy.
